Growth and Health Status Gap



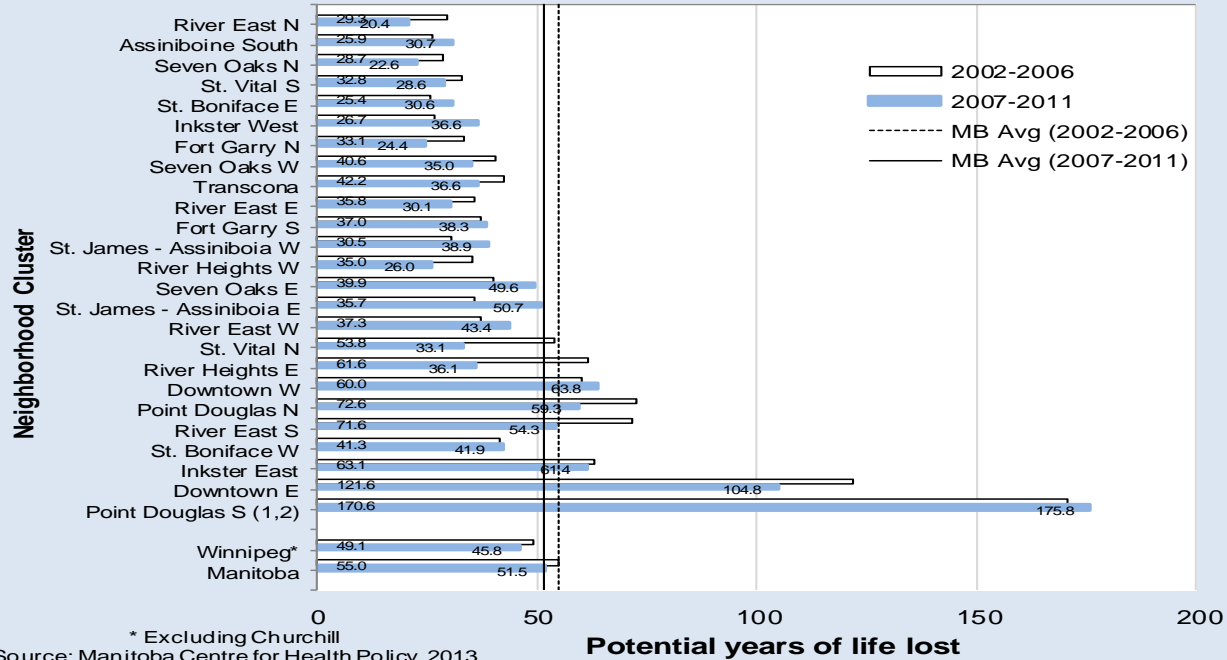
Migration and Translocation Shock

- Collectivism to Individualism



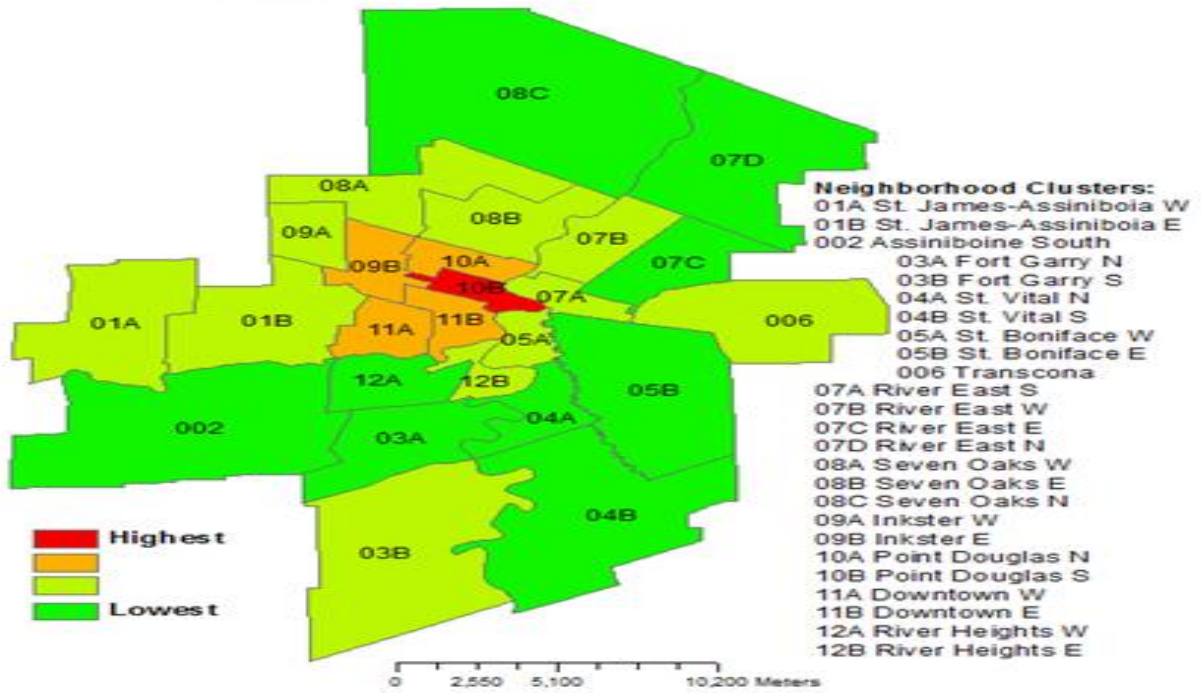
Potential Years of Life Lost (PYLL) by Winnipeg Neighbourhood Cluster

Age- and sex-adjusted annual rate of PYLL per 1,000 residents aged 1-74, 2002-2006 & 2007-2011

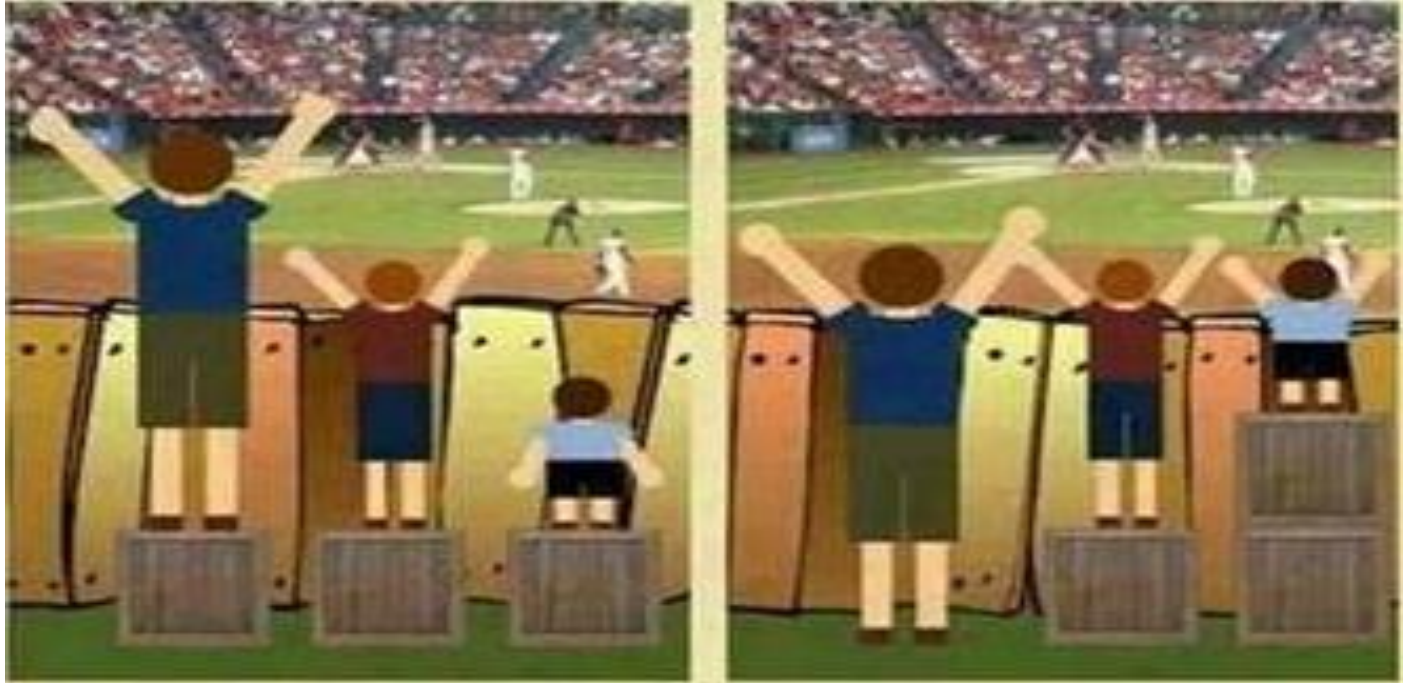




Potential Years of Life Lost by Winnipeg Neighborhood Cluster, 2007-2011

Large gaps exist in Winnipeg between those experiencing the best and poorest health. People living in some areas of Winnipeg have nearly 19 years lower life expectancy than people living in other parts of the city. Many of the gaps arise from unfair, unjust and modifiable social circumstances.
